# Service for Saturday in Holy Week (Easter Eve)

O Lord, open our lips, and our mouth shall proclaim your praise.

To you we lift our eyes, for you are enthroned in the heavens.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and shall be for ever. Amen.

Let us worship the Lord. **All praise to his name.** 

### **READINGS**

## Psalm 16

Keep me safe, my God, for in you I take refuge.

- <sup>2</sup> I say to the Lord, "You are my Lord; apart from you I have no good thing."
- <sup>3</sup> I say of the holy people who are in the land,
  - "They are the noble ones in whom is all my delight."
- <sup>4</sup> Those who run after other gods will suffer more and more. I will not pour out libations of blood to such gods or take up their names on my lips.

- <sup>5</sup> Lord, you alone are my portion and my cup; you make my lot secure.
- <sup>6</sup> The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places; surely I have a delightful inheritance.
- <sup>7</sup> I will praise the Lord, who counsels me; even at night my heart instructs me.
- <sup>8</sup> I keep my eyes always on the Lord. With him at my right hand, I will not be shaken.
- <sup>9</sup> Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices; my body also will rest secure,
- 10 because you will not abandon me to the realm of the dead, nor will you let your faithful[b] one see decay.
- <sup>11</sup> You make known to me the path of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand.

# Old Testament reading: Hosea 6: 1-6

"Come, let us return to the Lord. He has torn us to pieces but he will heal us; he has injured us but he will bind up our wounds. <sup>2</sup> After two days he will revive us; on the third day he will restore us, that we may live in his presence.<sup>3</sup> Let us acknowledge the Lord; let us press on to acknowledge him. As surely as the sun rises, he will appear; he will come to us like the winter rains, like the spring rains that water the earth." <sup>4</sup> "What can I do with you, Ephraim? What can I do with you, Judah? Your love is like the morning mist, like the early dew that disappears. <sup>5</sup> Therefore I cut you in pieces with my prophets, I killed you with the words of my mouth— then my judgments go forth like the sun. <sup>6</sup> For I desire mercy, not sacrifice, and acknowledgment of God rather than burnt offerings.

## Salvator Mundi

Jesus, Saviour of the world, come to us in your mercy: we look to you to save and help us.

By your cross and life laid down you set your people free: we look to you to save and help us.

New Testament reading: 1 Peter 3: 17-22

<sup>17</sup> For it is better, if it is God's will, to suffer for doing good than for doing evil. <sup>18</sup> For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. He was put to death in the body but made alive in the Spirit. <sup>19</sup> After being made alive, <sup>[a]</sup> he went and made proclamation to the imprisoned spirits— <sup>20</sup> to those who were disobedient long ago when God waited patiently in the days of Noah while the ark was being built. In it only a few people, eight in all, were saved through water, <sup>21</sup> and this water symbolizes baptism that now saves you also—not the removal of dirt from the body but the pledge of a clear conscience toward God. <sup>[b]</sup> It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ, <sup>22</sup> who has gone into heaven and is at God's right hand—with angels, authorities and powers in submission to him.

## Nunc Dimittis:

Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace: according to thy word. For mine eyes have seen thy salvation: which thou hast prepared before the face of all peoples.

To be a light to lighten the gentiles: and to be the glory of thy people Israel. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son: and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith. We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Those who are baptised are called to worship and serve God.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ? **With the help of God, I will.** 

Will you seek and serve Christ in all people, loving your neighbour as yourself? With the help of God, I will.

Will you acknowledge Christ's authority over human society, by prayer for the world and it's leaders,

by defending the weak, and by seeking peace and justice? With the help of God, I will.

Let us pray.

Almighty God, you have given us the will to do all these things: Give us the courage and strength to achieve them To the honour and glory of your name, and the good of your Church and people; through Jesus our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.** 

May Christ dwell in our hearts through faith, that we may be rooted and grounded in love and bring forth the fruit of the Spirit. **Amen.**
